SUMMARY

The meeting brought together people from 2 East Devon environmental organisations, Dennings Down Farm and Green Futures Devon to identify the key priorities for action in order to help the whole of the East Devon area to reduce its use of pesticides.

- 1. To engage proactively with the wider community of individuals, groups and organisations across East Devon around becoming involved in the Pesticide-Free East Devon process.
- 2. Identify what is already happening on the ground to encourage pesticide-free / reduced pesticide approaches.
- 3. Organise a Pesticide-Free East Devon event in Spring 2027 to bring the whole community together to share best practice, be inspired and motivated and build stronger networks and partnerships.

Is Pesticide-Free Possible? - Stefan Drew

Stefan gave a very informative presentation about the history of pesticide use and some of the current alternatives being used across the world.

- Alternatives to Pesticides Mechanical robot weeding Lazer weeding
- Arguments for Farmers and Councils to go Pesticide-Free Soil health Reduced production costs Greater resilience Enhanced biodiversity Improved public health

An Introduction to Whole Health Agriculture – Nicola Westlake

Nicola talked about her work with the Whole Health Agriculture organisation.

- Based on herbal and homeopathic preparations for livestock.
- Now branching out to Arable.
- No judgement of farmers who use conventional methods
- Work is being evidenced through peer-reviewed research
- Soil Association Field lab looking at fly-strike in sheep
- British Vetinary Association is advising farmers to use less insecticides

IDENTIFYING THE KEY ISSUES FOR A PESTICIDE-FREE EAST DEVON

- Give people alternatives
- Share information.
- Identifying and solving problems show where alternatives have worked
- Provide evidence
- Showing on the ground practical examples E.g. River Axe and River Kit work
- Show how alternates save money
- Tell the story E.g. The Otter Story James Willams
- Who are we engaging with?
- Facilitate connection between the different groups
- Linking different groups Online and through Events
- Organisations to engage with Trill Farm, CAG and Blackdown National Landscape
